St. Michael's Lutheran School is a co-educational primary school offering contemporary education from Foundation through to Year 6. Located in the township of Hahndorf in the Adelaide Hills, St. Michael's has been offering Lutheran education to the Adelaide Hills Community since 1839.

St Michael's offers the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program from Foundation to Year 6. Through a program of inquiry, students learn to be independent thinkers with a passion for learning. The school provides a wide variety of experiences for students, designed to enable all students to fulfil their potential. St Michael's students are supported to wonder, challenge, explore and discover.

Organised into multi-age learning communities, St Michael's students think outside of the box. We embrace the diversity of every child, as students strive to reach their potential.

With outstanding facilities, St Michael's is a school where students have abundant opportunities to learn both inside and outdoors as they develop skills and contribute to the community.

Throughout the year, St Michael's has provided a wide range of curricular and extracurricular opportunities for our students. We foster students desire to wonder about their world, embrace challenge, and explore openly and so that students can make new and creative discoveries.

As an International Baccalaureate World School, St Michaels' is committed to developing globally minded students who are diverse thinkers, with a heart for service.

At the core of our school are the Christian beliefs and values, which underpin all learning. Students participate in worship, devotion and Christian Studies lessons as a normal part of the school week. The school has a close relationship with St Michael's Lutheran Church and share facilities for many events and opportunities to gather.

At St Michael's, student achievement is not just measured in academic pursuits. Students are encouraged to live out the IB Learner Profile through Physical Education, the Arts, Languages, Science and indeed all curriculum areas. Students inquire into their interests and passions. In addition, we understand that a student's social and emotional wellbeing is critical to ensuring that our students are balanced people prepared to contribute to the community.

International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (IB PYP)

In 2024, St Michael's completed its five-year IB Evaluation, which reviews how well we meet programme standards, improve implementation, and gather input from our community. The evaluation covers four key areas: Purpose, Culture, Learning, and Environments.

Our self-evaluation began in 2023 with staff reflecting on our practices and engaging parents and students for their insights. We submitted required documentation, including a Programme Development Plan focused on inclusion. In April 2024, staff, students, and parents met remotely with IB evaluators over two days to discuss teaching and learning at our school.

The final report, received in June 2024, highlighted our strengths in collaboration, individualised learning, student voice, and our nurturing, inclusive learning environment. Evaluators noted strong development in Purpose and Environments, and performance beyond expectations in areas such as curriculum design, student support, and approaches to teaching.

We were encouraged to involve the community more in revising our required IB policies of Language, Academic Integrity, Admissions, Inclusion, and Assessment and to strengthen our assessment strategies. No critical issues were found.

Suggestions also included further utilising our knowledgeable parent community in student inquiries and deepening our understanding of international-mindedness in order to build global connections and empathy.

This valuable feedback will guide us to fulfill our mission statement to help each student flourish and achieve excellent academic growth by nurturing a passion for learning and a caring Christian attitude.

Camps and Outdoor Education

Student Leadership

St Michael's places a high priority on student leadership and in 2024, numerous leadership opportunities enabled students to take an active role in the decision making and running of the school.

The House Captains take ownership of managing the sport equipment allocation during recess and lunch times, leading House worship and organising House events. Student leaders also worked in the St Michael's church café once week as well as assist with Kindergym. Senior students assist in managing library book returns and our weekly worship time.

School Captains, Brooke Stewart and Grace Catalano ably led school assemblies and fulfilled roles representing our school at ANZAC day, Remembrance Day and in public speaking at school events.

The Community House Leaders met regularly to discuss ideas to improve our school and provide fun events for our students to enjoy. They also organised House Devotion throughout the year. Throughout the year the Community House Leaders hosted a number of special events to raise funds for a variety of local and international charaties.

Throughout the year students gathered tinned and dry goods to give to Lutheran Community Care at Christmas.

Hahndorf Creek Rehabilitation Award and Gardening Australia

The project which began in 2018 continues with ongoing maintenance and learning.

In 2024 St Michael's won the SA Junior Landcare award for the work that the students have been doing to rehabilitate the Hahndorf Creek. In 2025 St Michael's will represent SA in the National Landcare Awards.

Following the award the school was contacted by Gardening Australia to film and episode of the national program. The crew and preenter, Sophie Thompson, spent the day with the Creek Club students learning about the project and the learning that the students do in the creek.

Robotics and Coding

Using digital technology to enhance learning for students is a natural part of schooling at St Michael's. With a 1:1 iPad program, the school is well placed to provide opportunities for students.

From Foundation to Year 6, students are involved in robotics and coding experiences.

Digital Technologies are integrated into units of inquiry as students learn to use technology to create and present learning. Digital media creation continues to be a large part of the curriculum as students of all ages use the green screen to create media.

A dedicated 'maker space' provides an area for students to get creative and work on long term, creative projects, both during class time and in lunchtime clubs.

The school continues to add to its array of 'tools' for digital learning and in 2024 our senior students created 3D projects and printed them on a 3D printer acquired by the school. Students also began to learn with Edison Robots.

Outdoor Learning

St Michael's has a number of beautiful outdoor spaces constructed specifically for outdoor exploration and learning. It is our belief that the school is for the students and therefore all spaces should be areas of wonder and learning. The school has a sensory Garden and Outdoor Learning space which are kept natural for stick, dirt, mud and water play.

Science Week

In 2024 National Science week was celebrated at St Michael's. With a theme 'Species Survival - More than just Sustainability', the students enjoyed a number of scientific activities throughout he week exploring survival of animals and plant life. We also held our annual 'staff dress as a scientist' guessing competition, which is much loved by our students.

PYP Exhibition

As part of our commitment to the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program, St Michaels holds an exhibition of learning for our Year 6 students each year.

The Exhibition is the 'culmination' experience of our students learning at St Michael's. The students spent the best part of a term researching, collaborating and creating presentations of their learning. They present to family and dignitaries alike, with confidence and authority in their chosen topic.

Additionally, each student needs to produce a creative piece which represents their learning and a combined performance representing the Central Idea as a whole. Exhibition is an exciting, challenging and very engaging part of the curriculum at St Michael's.

In 2024 all staff members were mentors for our students, supporting them to inquire deeper into their topic of choice. The Central Idea was Working together for a common purpose builds community, under the Transdisciplinary theme of Sharing the Planet. This Central idea enabled students to explore a wide range of ways communities work together.

Showcases

Learning Showcases are one way that St Michael's students demonstrate their learning to their parents. These evenings are an interactive culmination of a unit of inquiry, providing our families with detail about specific outcomes.

In 2024, all students were involved in a Learning Showcase during the year. Learning Showcases form part of the schools' reporting processes. In 2024 these Showcases explored how people live, work and play in communities, (Beginning Learning Community F/1) considered how the environment in a region influences how people live.(Junior Learning Community 2/3) and designed prototypes for new arcade games. (Middle Learning Community 4/5).

ICAS Achievement

Each year many St Michael's students participate in the International Competitions and Assessment for School (ICAS). ICAS online assessments are held in a variety of subject areas, across 41 countries. This year, a number of our students received Credits, Distinctions and High Distinction certificates for their efforts. We were very excited to celebrate with Emily (Yr 3) and James (Yr 5) who received a Medals.

Medals are given to the student who achieves the highest score in Australia for their year level. To be a medal winner is an outstanding (and rare) achievement.

Bene Nursing Home Visits

During 2024 the St Michael's Beginning Learning Community was able to visit and make connections with some of the residents Bene Nursing Home. The students visited fortnightly and spent time doing a variety of activities and sang songs to the residents.

Active Travel Days

As a Way2Go school, St Michael's strongly encourages students to find active ways to get to school. Each term we hold an Active Travel Day where students walk, ride or scoot to school.

These days are immensely popular with our students and since this initiative began, we have seen a distinct rise in the number of students using active ways to travel to school.

Colour Run

The annual Colour Run is always highly anticipated by our students. Held at the end of the year, this event includes a variety of land and water activities designed to be fun and interactive. A whole heap of messy fun is had by all.









Specialist Subjects

At St Michael's our students study Creative Arts, German and Sport with specialist teachers. Each of these subject teachers work with the classroom teachers to enhance the units of inquiry being studied each term, through integrating their specialist area into the Unit of Inquiry. This enhances engagement and provides depth to the area of study, showing children the integrated nature of learning, in action.

Mother's Day Breakfast

The annual Mother's Day breakfast is held in our gymnasium, Bukatila. A large number of mother's attended the continental style breakfast, followed by our special Mother's Day worship. We enjoyed the opportunity to thank our school mums for all that they do to support students at St Michael's.

Reconciliation Action Plan

In 2024 we updated our R.A.P which was subsequently endorsed by Nurragunnawali. The Reconciliation Action team consisted of staff, students, external consultants and Jade Brooke, proud indigenous woman and cultural representative and advisor. We are grateful to Jade for her support of our RAP.

The 2024 vision was:

We believe in a reconciled Australia, where all Australians have a great sense of pride in and develop an understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' histories and cultures.

We believe First Peoples' cultures and continuing contributions are an integral part of who we are as Australians. We commit to actively respecting the wisdom and cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples so that present and emerging generations can be enriched by the generosity of First Nations People and their willingness of sharing their knowledge of the Lands, the Seas, the Sky and the Waterways, and the Stories that connects them all.

We acknowledge that reconciliation must involve an understanding of the true histories of Australia, justice and healing. Our work towards greater understanding, learning and respect within our school community to continue to work towards a reconciled Australia.

We continue building, strong, authentic relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, in particular with the Kaurna and Peramangk peoples, who are the Custodians of the Land on which we learn, work and play.

We also acknowledge neighbouring Language Groups and the connection they have had and continue to have on the shared Kaurna and Peramangk Country.

Throughout the year a wide range of professional learning experiences occurred with staff and students were engaged with integrated learning opportunities. Across the year a number of guest speakers visited our classrooms to share first hand knowledge and understanding.



Choir

In a collaboration with Cornerstone College, St Michael's continues to provide our students the opportunity to be in the Senior Choir. Led by Cornerstone Music Teachers, our MLC students and SLC made up the choir in 2024. Throughout the year they performed at school events, Autumn Fest and Cornerstone Cabaret.

Concert

The 2024 Concert was performed by the Beginning and Junior Learning Communities. They journeyed back in time to re-enact the Christmas story in a production called Camel-lot!

Thanks to the students and staff for all their hard work to make the production such as success - everyone did an amazing job! With input from the students and props and backdrops created by children, the musical performance was a highlight of the year and a memorable experience for all involved

Wellbeing at St Michael's

St Michael's strives to provide a safe environment where student's social and emotional learning needs are met through evidence-based, whole school practices.

St Michael's takes inclusion seriously, working hard to ensure that the needs of our students are met so that they are able to learn effectively and thrive, no matter the challenges they face.

Often, this includes adjusting the environment or the task in order for students to achieve success. At St Michael's there is not a 'one size fits all' mindset but rather a 'what fits you' way of thinking.

To this end, St Michael's has a dedicated wellbeing room, created to provide a space where students can take scheduled breaks, or find a quiet place to reset their "engines" as required.

Several times each week our school 'Wellbeing Dog', Raz, visits the school to spread joy and calm throughout the grounds. He is an important member of our well-being team and a sought after "teacher" when students require assistance to regulate themselves.

The Wellbeing room also has an external garden. This garden is well utilised by students who find the peaceful space assists them to self-regulate.

Catering for and respecting diversity is deeply valued at St Michael's. For this reason, our classrooms are designed with flexible learning spaces which consider the needs of all students in the classroom.

Each year we celebrate Harmony Week with special activities to highlight and develop mutual understanding and appreciation for our sameness and difference as individuals within the local and wider community.

Throughout the year, our Diverse Learning Coordinator presents children's talks and whole school activities designed to educate students in areas such as self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, relationship skills and responsible decision making (Casel, 2017).

Students are also offered targeted, individual/small group assistance, as required. Within this context, students are provided with the opportunity to develop their own understanding of themselves as learners, and identify and practice strategies to maximise their sense of well-being.

Evidence-based and highly regarded programmes including "What's the Buzz" and "Seasons for Growth" are also delivered regularly throughout the school year.

Kindergym

Affiliated with Gymnastics SA and led by our PE Teacher and Accredited Kindergym coach, Steven Braun, Kindergym runs every Thursday morning during term time.

Kindergym incorporates movement, music and fun to support muscle and brain development in young children.

The program consistently attracts up to 60 pre-school aged children from the Adelaide Hills Community.

2024 Parent, Staff and Student Feedback

In 2024 some students and families were invited to be part of a forum to identify areas of growth for the strategic direction of the school.

Families were also invited to provide feedback via a 'new family' survey and a School Leavers survey.

Throughout the year the Principal also underwent a review led by the Board. These Principal reviews occur every 3 years and inform the Principal's Professional Learning. Additionally, the school participated in the National Wellbeing Survey, as we do annually. This survey provides us with data over time on the impact of our wellbeing practices.

Students have been provided with community letter boxes which provide anonymous opportunities for our students to provide feedback or raise concerns, should they wish to do so.

Process for Managing Absence

Student attendance is:

- Checked daily
- Calculated termly and recorded on school reports
- Later arrivals at school sign in at the front office
- Students absent without explanation will be followed up with an SMS message and phone call
- Explained absences are accompanied by a written explanation or notation in record.
- Anomalies are followed up by the principal

St Michael's had a 95% participation rate. 38 Students were eligible to participate. 2 students were withdrawn by their caregivers.

In all domains St Michael's recorded a **strong** proficiency level.

Proficiency Levels are as follows:

The NAPLAN proficiency standards include 4 proficiency levels for each assessment area at each year level:

- Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- **Developing**: the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- **Needs additional support**: the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

12 students across Year 3 and 5 recorded 'exceeding' proficiency levels in one or more of their individual results.

7 Students across Year 3 and 5 recorded that they 'need additional support' in at least one domain.

St Michael's has a history of supporting students with diverse learning needs.
